

How to get to Brussels from the airport ?

Trains (operated by the SNCB/NMBS – in grey on the map hereunder)

There is a railway station within the Airport, served by four hourly trains to Brussels from approximately 5h30 till Midnight.

All trains stop at the three major stations in Brussels : Bruxelles-Nord/Brussel-Noord, Bruxelles-Central/Brussel-Centraal and Bruxelles-Midi/Brussel-Zuid, where connections with most domestic services are available.

Practical information

Journey time :

- to Bruxelles-Nord/Brussel-Noord : about 15 minutes (direct trains), 20 minutes (other trains);
- to Bruxelles-Midi/Brussel-Zuid : about 22 minutes (direct trains), 28 minutes (other trains).

Fares to Brussels (any railway station): 2,80 € (one way, October 2007).

Bus 12 (Airport Line) (operated by the STIB/MIVB-in red on the map hereunder)

The Airport Line is an express bus service to Brussels, serving the European District and the NATO headquarters. Buses run every 20-30 minutes from Monday to Sunday, from approximately 5h45 till 23h.

Practical information

Journey time :

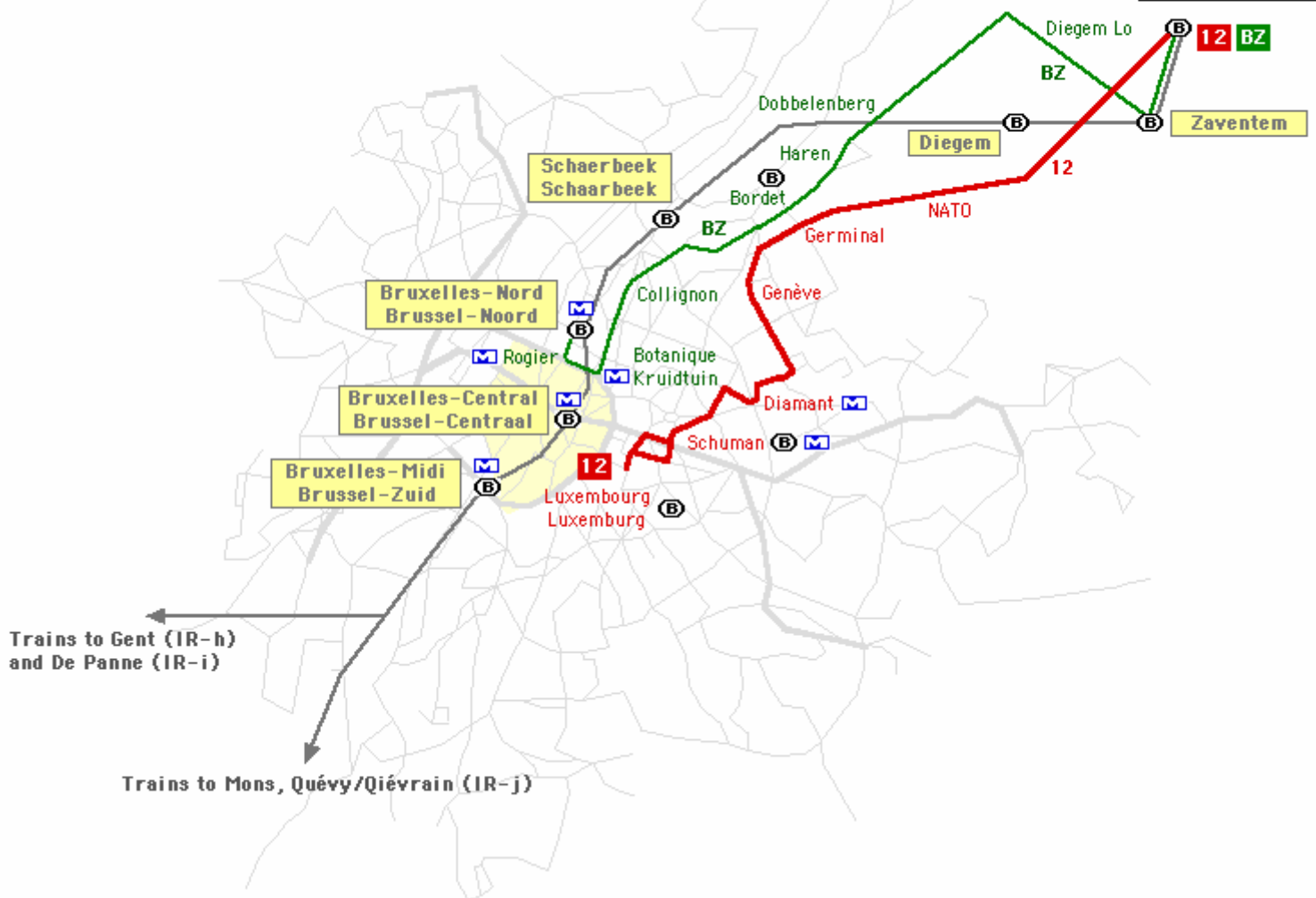
- to the NATO headquarters : about 8-10 minutes ;
- to Schuman (European Commission) : about 25-35 minutes ;
- to Luxembourg (European Parliament) : about 30-40 minutes (*service from Monday to Friday, from 7 AM to 7 PM only*).

Fares :

- from/to the airport : 3 €
- other journey : 1,50 €

The ticket is valid one hour on the whole STIB/MIVB network. Within that time, you can change at no cost to any metro, tram or bus line.
